

PARKS PART TIME LABORER

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Under supervision of the Parks Manager or Parks Lead Municipal Service Worker, performs a wide variety of unskilled maintenance and construction work on city parks, cemetery and other public facilities. Hours are 25 hours per week, year round.

DUTIES-EXAMPLES OF WORK

ESSENTIAL DUTIES ARE: Performs unskilled manual labor as required, along with assisting in the performance of semi-skilled and skilled work; works with hand tools necessary to fill graves, spray weeds, mow grass, irrigate parks and cemetery; may operate weed cutters, riding mowers, dump truck and pickup truck; may run hand power equipment including power mowers, compactors and chain saws; may paint miscellaneous equipment used in the operation of the department and may flag traffic.

OTHER DUTIES INCLUDE: performs other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

1. Knowledge and skill in the safe work practices in the operation of light equipment, power tools and in safe methods of performing maintenance and construction work.
2. Perform moderate/heavy physical work and to lift and carry up to 50 pounds regularly and occasionally 100 pounds.
3. Stand, climb, kneel, twist, grasp, reach, ride, walk, sit, bend, crawl, push, pull and perform a variety of similar body movements.
4. Possess hand/eye/foot coordination to operate equipment.
5. Talk and hear in person and by radio; ability to see and read instructions, prepare reports and make repairs. Establish and maintain effective working relationships with supervisors, co-workers and general public.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to graduation from high school and six months of general labor experience.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Must possess a valid Colorado Drivers License. Must successfully pass a background check and pre-employment drug test.
