CITY OF DELTA GOALS

GOAL	What this means:
Celebrate Delta!	We want to celebrate our community including our amazing people and assets like our golf course, Confluence Park, Con-Trails, Recreation Center, ACCESS to the outdoors, fun community events, civic organizations, and business community. We believe our pride could use a little boost, and want to focus on ways to reengage with all of our citizens. We want to have a clean, well maintained community that everyone is proud to call home. That starts here with a recommitment by the City to engage more with our community, keep our city clean, take care of our assets, and make informed decisions to guide us into the future. For the City to be successful, we need our entire staff and organization on board.
Invest and <u>reinvest</u> in our infrastructure	Our infrastructure is in need of attention. We need to reinvest in maintaining, repairing, and replacing what we have, and make sure we can take care of any new infrastructure we build.
Broaden our economy and focus on community development	Our business community needs our help. We need to be more business friendly in our implementation of policies and regulations, demonstrate to our business community that we support them, and are here to help clear hurdles out of their way so they can be successful. We need to make sure workers in our community can afford housing by supporting industries that pay livable wages, and that they have access to affordable housing, daycare, healthcare, and other essential services.
Downtown Revitalization	Main Street should be a cool place to stop, eat, and be entertained. We want to see a business in every store front on Main Street, and people taking advantage of a vibrant downtown atmosphere. We want to ride our bikes on our trail system along the Gunnison River, take a selfie in front of our amazing public art, stop at the coffee shop for some great coffee on the way home, and then come back in the evening for music and amazing food. Let's create this!
Keep our City safe	We are concerned about crime. We want to invest in community policing and mental health support to be more proactive in reducing crime before it starts. We believe we need to tackle the drug problem that our community experiences, and help find solutions for supporting our homeless population.
Be a leader in regional collaboration	The City of Delta is the hub for the entire county. Our location between Grand Junction and Montrose is an opportunity yet to be captured. Many of our needs like transportation, broadband, and tourism are directly connected to our neighbors in all direction and we need to take a leadership role in the region so that Delta can realize its full potential as a City and as a regional hub.

Engage our Community	 Build bridges with our businesses, and encourage creation of a Main Street Business entity like a DDA. Start a Diversity Committee to help the City meet the needs of all residents of the City. Establish a Leadership Program to grow future community leaders.
Celebrate our Employees	 Build strong teams with leadership development programs, management training, mentorships, and reward programs. Encourage cross department collaboration at all levels of the organization. Celebrate the diversity of our work teams. Empower our employees to identify and implement solutions to challenges. Encourage all employees to be proactive. Recognize and reward those that go above and beyond to make Delta a great place for our residents.

Identify specific roads that are in need of repair and develop a strategy to move the projects forward.	• 9 th Street, 4 th Street, Grand, 16 th , and A street are all in desperate need of repair. Engineering needs to be completed for these streets, and funding secured. This may require a bond and tax question to the voters to achieve.

Invest in redundancy in critical infrastructure	 Make sure our power system, sewer system, and water system can be taken offline and maintained by building critical redundancies.

Police Building	 Find a new home for police department that fits our needs and solves the problems of a building that is too small for our modern police department.

If we plan on building it, we must plan on maintaining it from Day 1. This must be our mantra!

Keep our City safe	Description & Examples:
Support the Abraham Connection Shelter	 Work with the Board of Directors to find additional funding to support shelter services and support programs year round. Encourage City Departments to volunteer at the shelter. Engage with the State to find solutions and funding to reduce the homeless population.
Reduce Crime and Drugs	 Increase community policing practices. Support Back the Badge and use new funds to target crime reduction Support efforts to increase access to mental health support, domestic violence prevention, and drug rehabilitation.
Emergency Management	 Train and plan for emergencies. Increase communication and coordination with the County Emergency Manager, and State Emergency Management. Provide training to our business community to be better prepared in the event of business disruption from disaster.

Be a leader in regional collaboration	Description & Examples:
Be an active participant in all regional discussions	 Take an active role at the table with all regional partners and conversations. Advocate for Delta's needs. Support our neighbor communities in advocating for their needs. Develop a clear message and work towards implementation of solutions for enhanced transportation, broadband, economic development, and tourism partnerships.
Partner with the County in areas of common interest	 Work with County to develop a plan and strategy for increasing development potential at and around the airport. Be an active participant with the County to identify a solution for the Carnegie Library that preserves the building and ensures ongoing Library services for Delta residents.
