- 2.68.010 Statutes Governing City Elections. Unless conducted as part of a coordinated election, all City elections shall be governed by and conducted pursuant to the Colorado Municipal Election Code of 1965, Article 10 of Title 31, C.R.S., as amended from time to time (hereinafter, the "Municipal Election Code"), the provisions of which are hereby adopted by this reference. Any City election conducted as part of a coordinated election shall be governed by and conducted pursuant to the Uniform Election Code of 1992, Articles 1-13 of Title 1, C.R.S., as amended from time to time.
- <u>2.68.020</u> Conduct of City Elections. Unless conducted as part of a coordinated election, all City elections shall be conducted by mail ballot according to the mail ballot procedures set forth in the Municipal Election Code.
- 2.68.030 Write-in Candidate Affidavit of Intent. No write-in vote for any City office shall be counted unless an affidavit of intent to be a write-in candidate has been filed with the Clerk by the person wishing to be a write-in candidate no later than the date required under the Municipal Election Code. The affidavit of intent must indicate the office to which the affiant desires election and that the affiant is qualified to assume the office if elected.
- 2.68.040 Cancellation of Elections. If the only matter before the voters is the election of persons to office and if, at the close of business on the date required under the Municipal Election Code, there are not more candidates than offices to be filled at such election, including candidates filing affidavits of intent, the Clerk, if instructed by resolution of the City Council either before or after such date, shall cancel the election and by resolution declare the candidates elected. Upon such declaration the candidates shall be deemed elected and shall take office at the next regular meeting following the date upon which the election would have

occurred as provided by the City Charter. Notice of cancellation shall be published, if possible, and shall be posted at each polling place and in not less than one other public place. (Ord. 21, 2007; Ord. 3, 2017)
