



Emergency Power Release Policy and Form

- In the event of an electrical power outage, please contact your power company.
- This procedure is to be used in the event that electrical service has been disrupted for either residential or commercial properties.
- The following will be considered emergencies that warrant an emergency power release prior to the final electrical inspection: vehicular damage; storm damage; fire damage; equipment failure; or, meter damage. This is not an all-encompassing list but should cover the majority of the requests made.
- The building official authorizes work to commence prior to the issuance of a permit, so long as the application for electrical permit and this emergency power release form are received at the City of Delta building department (360 Main Street, Delta Colorado 81416) by the end of the first working day that follows the day such work commenced.
- A licensed and registered electrical contractor with the State of Colorado will be required to make the power release request. The electrical contractor must schedule a time with the building department to meet the inspector on site for final inspection after all work is done.
