Lead pipe

Magnets do not stick to lead

If you scratch the pipe with a coin, the scraped area will appear shiny silver and flake



Copper pipe

Magnets do not stick to copper pipes.

If you scratch the pipe with a coin, the scraped area will appear copper in color, the same as a penny.



Galvanized steel pipe

Magnets will stick to the surface of a galvanized steel

If you scratch the pipe with a coin, it will appear dull and gray.
